D. Fire Report (Chief Suzuki):

1. Fire Station 2 (Yosemite) is open, with ribbon cutting occurring Oct. 20th.
2. Chief Sherrard retiring, Chief Stelling will stay on until March for permanent replacement.
3. Staffing: Hiring FF's, 4 moving on to next stage of hiring.
4. Paramedic shortage continues to be an ongoing regional problem.
5. County Active shooter training postponed to February.
6. Station 1 will undergo termite tenting, currently postponed.

E. Police (Captain Morales):

1. Looked into gang activity at Burnett area from prior PSEPC meeting. Spoke with principal, there had not been any gang activity.
2. Citywide gang related crimes have been minor. Damage was sustained at Cardoza Park, and juveniles have been arrested.
3. Staffing: hired academy graduate officer, vacancies down to 5, two promising laterals officers moving through the hiring process. Three potential candidates for entry-level positions. Recruitment has been challenging.
