LIAISON REPORT

Milpitas Unified School District (MUSD) Report (School Board Member Lien):

- a. Milpitas Kindergartners thru 6th grade, and 9th graders will return to in person learning in the beginning of April. Jr. High School age children which need target support will return to school in the beginning. School children will be subject to health screenings twice per month.
- b. The school district is receiving \$16M from the State to begin 2nd phase of construction for Mable Mattos Elementary School.

Emergency Services Report (OEM Coordinator Charlop):

- a. Emergency Operations Plan (EOP): OEM Coordinator Charlop hosted two community collaboration meetings inviting different perspectives and input from different sectors the community, to include the school district, small and large industry, medical, senior and cultural community centers, non-English speaking populations, animal assistance, low incoming families and housing assistance programs. The final draft of the EOP is intended to go to Council for review and adoption in Spring of 2021.
- b. CERT Program Update: OEM ordered four Conex boxes for new CERT caches to be delivered to Cardoza Park, Spangler Elementary, Sinnott Park and Cerrano Park. OEM should be taking delivery of the boxes in the coming weeks.

Fire Report (Chief Frawley):

- a. COVID Mobile Testing Unit ceased operations in February 2021 in order to move toward with facilitate the vaccination process.
- b. MFD is partnered with the Santa Clara County of Public Health to vaccinate first responders. MFD continues to support the efforts to ramp up vaccinations for teachers and other essential workers. The vaccinations continue to be distributed in a tiered system with limited supply.

Police (Captain Morales):

- a. Discussion over the Grooming Policy, regarding facial hair.
- b. Officers have teamed up with distance learning kids to play online games with officers via virtual engagement.
- c. Interim Chief Hernandez has researched hate crimes in Milpitas against Asians and no crimes have been reported in the last five years. MPD has put more officers on patrol in Asian shopping centers.
- d. Interim Chief Hernandez reported on translation services available through Rapid Deploy Text 911.

Council Report (Council Member Dominguez): No report.
