BUSINESS ITEMS	A. 2022 Commission Work Plan Assignments: Neighborhood Specific Emergency Preparedness Programs (Clendenin & Berryhill): No updates Promote E-Prep in Community and Faith-Based Organizations (Nakapalau & Nichols): Nakapalau is working with a group to review their plans. Nichols is working with local churches to get in front of them when they go back in-person, many plan for April. Clendenin to connect Nichols with Christ Community Church on S. Park Victoria. LIAISON REPORT

Council Report (Council Member Dominguez):

1. Councilmember Dominguez will provide a report to Council on the work of the Commission.
2. American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funded \$85k to Milpitas Public Safety. Commissioner Dominguez would like more officers walking beat areas.
3. Councilmember is hosting Cyber-Bullying and Bullying Prevention Sessions. Contact the Councilmember for more information.
4. Councilmember Dominguez is requesting for “smash & grab” information to be put out to the public with the assistance of the commissioners in high break-in vehicle areas.

Milpitas Unified School District (MUSD) Report (School Board Member Lien):

1. No Updates.

Emergency Services Report (OEM Coordinator Charlop):

1. CERT Update: OEM Coordinator has been working with CERT members on a new communication tool program.
2. RACES Update: RACES is focused on completing the communications van transition in the next 60 – 90 days. RACES is also updating the radio and packet information in the primary and alternate emergency operations centers.
3. Other Updates: OEM’s Office is moving to Milpitas Police Department.

Fire Report (Chief Maloon):

1. Battalion Chief Stelling has been promoted to Deputy Chief.
2. Battalion Chief recruitments will begin next week.
3. Captain recruitments to begin in April.
4. Engineer recruitments to begin in May.
5. New Fire Engine approved, with anticipated build out to take 2 years.
6. Two new wildland vehicles to be delivered.
7. Fire Station 2 (Yellowstone & S. Park Victoria) to be completed this summer.
8. Ambulance expected to be in service in August.

Police (Sgt. Speckenheuer):

1. MPD is hosting with Milpitas Toyota, a catalytic converter etching program on March 23.
2. MPD is hosting a virtual dispatch recruitment with Q&A.
3. MPD newly promoted Capt. Torrez, Capt. Miller, Lt. Solis and Sgt. Jackson.
4. MPD is subject to AB481, requiring MPD to report military equipment to Council, such as drones, weapons, etc.
5. MPD reaches out to Neighborhood Watch quarterly. In April a new neighborhood will be coming onboard.
6. MPD will be joining with the ProgNya Organization, to better assist officers in interactions with people with autism.

7. MPD is participating in “Recess with a Cop”, where MPD will attend recess with the elementary kids in the 2022-23 school year.
