VIII. New Business

1. Emergency Preparedness for Seniors – Toni Charlop, Emergency Services Coordinator – City of Milpitas

Background: Toni Charlop, Emergency Services Coordinator with the City of Milpitas would like to update the Senior Advisory Commission on emergency preparedness for seniors safety measures to consider at home in the event of an unforeseen emergency.

Recommendation: Receive presentation on emergency preparedness for seniors.

2. Interns to Support Technology for Seniors Program – John Macon, Recreation Services Supervisor – Senior Center

Background: For FY20/21, the Senior Center was awarded Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding to offer a Technology for Seniors program to qualifying seniors. This program seeks to counter social isolation and build greater connection to family, friends and the Milpitas Community. Chromebook devices are distributed to qualifying senior participants ages 62+ and they receive an initial orientation on the device, as well as continued tech support from unpaid college interns from San Jose State University's Public Health Department. The Technology for Seniors program will be sustained for at least the next 5 years and the program's design includes the continued use of interns to ensure its future success. As the Senior Advisory Commission discusses its FY20/21 Work Plan at its next meeting in June, it is recommended that SAC funding be considered to support the sustained use of interns for the Fall and Spring semesters.

Recommendation: Discuss and approve funding one (1) intern per semester and to consider a potential stipend of \$150 per student intern that would be awarded upon successful completion of 120-150 hours of service to the program.
