9. Business Items

a. Work Plan Events 2020-21

1. Career Day

Background: For the 2020-21 work plan The Youth Advisory Commission to provide and host a virtual career day for Milpitas Teens and partnering them with local Milpitas employers. This event would allow for teens to meet and understand what different career fields that presenters would provide and how their business can potentially relate to the teens interest.

Recommendation: Push this event to the YAC 2021-22 work plan, to allow for enough time to plan and allocate the logistics needed for this large event.

2. Film Competition

Background: The Youth Advisory Commission is looking to partner with both Milpitas High School teachers and the Arts Commission to provide and plan a film competition to which Milpitas Teens will be able to submit their films. MHS Staff and Arts Commission, will be asked to help judge the films and provide feedback to the students participating. The event is scheduled for May 15th.

Recommendation: Commissioners to provide flyer concept, event details, which include submission dates (April 16, 2021), requirements, flyer concept, categories etc. Commission to provide all updates.

3. Mental Health Awareness

Background: The Youth Advisory Commission has added the hosting of a Mental Health Awareness event, in hopes of partnering with National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI).

Recommendation: Commissioners are to schedule, plan, and promote the event to be hosted on April 21, 2021 virtually through zoom. Commissioners to provide details on progression of planning and final details at the April meeting.

4. Teen Center Events

Background: Each year, the Youth Advisory Commission partners with the Milpitas Teen Center to host, assist in planning, and promoting events for the Milpitas Teens. This year, due to the pandemic, the Youth Advisory Commission has decided to provide Milpitas Teens with care packages to be picked up by students.

Recommendation: Commission to move the Teen Center care package giveaway to the week before finals week (May 24-28, 2021), to which the commission will provide Teens with finals giveaway packet. This package will contain various items and print information that will help our students during finals. Commission to provide further details/ideas for the packet.

5. E-Sports

Background: The Milpitas High School E-Sports club submitted a proposal in partnership with the Youth Advisory Commission to host a virtual E-Sports tournament. This tournament would be hosted online for a weeklong period (Spring Break – April 12 to 16, 2021). This tournament would be comprised of mini games from the game Minecraft. From this tournament, winners would be provided prizes upon their placement.

Recommendation: Push this event to the YAC 2021-22 work plan, to allow for enough time to plan and allocate the logistics needed for this large event.

6. Tobacco Free Communities

Background: The City of Milpitas submitted a grant proposal for the County of Santa Clara Public Health Department (SCCPDH) Healthy Cities Project- Tobacco Free Communities Program. On February 13, 2020, staff received notification of the funding for the grant. The overall goals are to educate youth, parents and the community to prevent youth use of flavored tobacco and vaping products in the City of Milpitas and reduce tobacco retailers in Milpitas, grandfathering current retailers. Specific objectives include informing the public of any policy changes around tobacco sales and educating youth on methods used to advertise flavored tobacco products and e-cigarette and vaping devices, educate parents and “trusted adults” to recognize signs of youth tobacco use and effectively communicate with youth about the dangers.

The City of Milpitas will be entering into contract with the County of Santa Clara on the terms of the grant and will act as the grant administrator for the term of the agreement.

Recommendation: Take volunteers, no more than two, to form a Sub Committee to research current risks (short- and long-term health consequences, education, socio economic consequences of tobacco use and vaping), training videos, print and on-line campaign and town hall meetings.
