Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program



- **Grant Description:**
 - USDOT funds regional and local initiatives to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.
- **Funding Available: \$1.2 billion for FY2024.**
- **Two Grant Categories:**
 - Planning & Demonstration Grant
 - \$100k~\$10 million expected grant range
 - Implementation Grant
 - \$2.5 million~\$25 million expected grant range
 - Require Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP)
- **80% Federal | 20% local match**
- **Deadline was May 16, 2024**

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program

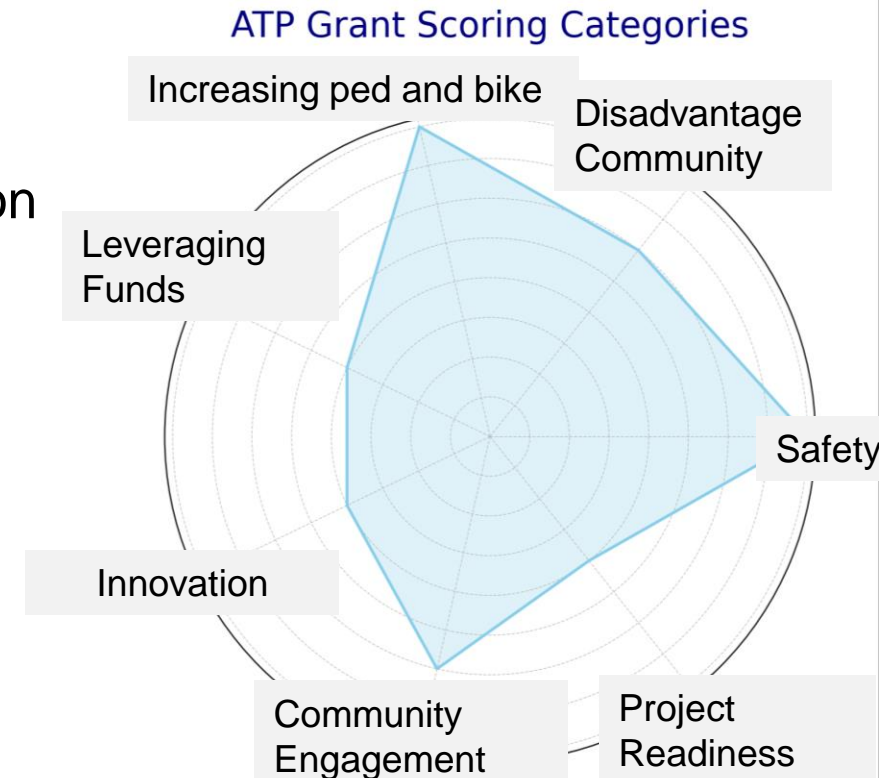


- **Submitted application on May 15, 2024.**
- **Application focused “Safe Routes to School” along 13 public schools**
- **Safety Enhancements Considerations:**
 - Speed feedback signs and school zone signs
 - Warning Beacons
 - Safety lighting
 - Raised medians and pedestrian refuge islands
- **Requested funding for \$2.9 million**
 - \$2.7 million for implementation
 - \$200k for supplemental planning
- **City's local match will be \$700k**
- **Results will be released by August 2024.**



Statewide and Regional Active Transportation Program Grants

- **Objective is to encourage the increased use of active modes of transportation.**
- **Funding Available:**
 - Statewide ATP - California Transportation Commission (CTC) - \$284 million
 - Regional ATP - Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) - \$49 million
- **Five Grant Categories:**
 - Small Infrastructure: total project cost \$250K~\$3.5 million
 - Medium Infrastructure: total project cost \$3.5 million ~\$10 million
 - Large Infrastructure: \$10 million +
 - Non-Infrastructure
 - Planning
- **Qualification Criteria:**
 - Scoring Rubrics are used as shown to the right
- **Local match:** CTC encourages 20% | MTC requires 11.47%
- ⁵ **Deadline June 17, 2024**



Statewide and Regional Active Transportation Program Grants



- **Will submit by June 17, 2024.**
- **Application focus along “Safe Routes to School”**
 - Five public schools and four private schools
 - 100% of funding will benefit disadvantaged communities
- **Safety Enhancement Considerations:**
 - Bulb-out
 - High visibility yellow crosswalk striping
- **Requested funding of \$4 million for medium infrastructure applications**
- **City's local match will be \$500K**
- **Results will be released by December 2024.**

Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)



➤ Grant Description:

- Federal program to achieve a reduction in fatalities and serious injuries on public roads.

➤ Funding Available: \$300 million

➤ Requires 10% City local match.

➤ Two Grant Categories:

- Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR) Application: \$252 million. Max \$10 million per agency.
 - Require Local Road Safety Plan
 - BCR ratio calculation
- Funding Set-asides: \$48 million. Max \$350K per agency.
 - BCR ratio calculation not required.
 - Guardrail upgrades; installing edge lines.

➤ Deadline September 9, 2024

➤ Application Status:

- Currently negotiating agreement with consultants.
- Application will focus on improvements identified in the adopted Citywide Travel Safety Plan.

Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE)



➤ **Grant Description:**

- Administered by the United States Department of Transportation
- Focus on surface transportation infrastructure projects that will improve safety, environmental sustainability, mobility, community connectivity, and equity.

➤ **Funding Available: \$1.5 billion**

- \$5 million to \$25 million grant range

➤ **Federal 80% | 20% local match**

➤ **Deadline was February 28, 2024**

➤ **Application Status:**

- Submitted application on February 27, 2024 requesting construction funding of \$17.5 million for the Montague Pedestrian Overcrossing Project, CIP No. 2018.
- City local match will be \$4.3 million.
- Results are expected to be released by the end of June 2024

- Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant (MPGD) – INFRA
- Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) - RCP/NAE
