Background: Annually the Commission reviews the Park Projects listed in the City's five-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to recommend project priority for City Council consideration. City Staff will review the list of Park projects.

Recommendation: Receive the Park Projects in the proposed 2027-2031 Capital Improvement Program and make recommendations for project priority for City Council consideration.

c. Innovation District Parks and Trails Master Plan – Lillian VanHua, Principal Planner

Background: Within the Innovation Subdistrict of the Milpitas Metro Specific Plan area, a publicly accessible park is planned adjacent to Berryessa Creek and the new roadway connection to S. Milpitas Boulevard Extension. The proposed park is designed to provide recreational opportunities for workers and provide open space in a district that currently lacks park space. Although the Innovation District prioritizes office and R&D development, it allows residential development adjacent to the proposed parks to create a campus-like setting. The proposed parks will serve employees and visitors to the area. Staff will present the final Innovation District Parks and Trails Master Plan.

Recommendation: Receive presentation and recommend that the City Council adopt the Innovation District Parks and Trails Master Plan.
